Lufkin Education Foundation is so appreciative to be at the receiving end of that support. We could not do it without the help of our Community Partners.




## 2021 at a glance

## High Five Club


In 2021, The Lufkin ISD Education Foundation raised over \$48,000 through the High 5 Campaign!
