2020 at a glance



The Lufkin ISD Education Foundation hosted its 2nd Annual Grant Showcase on Thursday, January 30, 2020 at the Pitser Garrison Convention Center. The Foundation invited corporate donors, community partners, and parents to see how their donations positively impacted teachers and students through innovative teaching grants. In 2019-2020, the Foundation awarded 25 classrooms grants totaling over \$58,000. These grants included: 10 STEM grants, 5 literacy grants, 2 physical education grants, and 8 social skills grants. All 25 grants were showcased at the event.
